



*C*hatmoss Country Club was built on part of the well-known, 2700-acre Hairston Plantation. The Club was organized in November 1958. J. Ellis Maples, one of the country's foremost golf course architects, was hired to design and build the golf course. Chatmoss opened for play on August 27, 1960.

The Club's many amenities include a fully stocked pro shop with the latest equipment and apparel, a practice facility with an all-grass tee area, a practice bunker, a putting green, golf lessons and club fitting.

Our indoor Sports Complex has three HarTru tennis courts, workout facility and hitting wall. There are also three lighted outdoor tennis courts. Our Olympic-sized swimming pool has a fully-trained staff for water safety instruction.

Nothing can compare to the newly-reconstructed clubhouse, decorated in splendid southern plantation style. It includes a ballroom which accommodates up to 300 guests, casual and formal dining areas, a member's lounge, private banquet rooms and full-service locker rooms.

Yardage Information

- ◊ Denotes sprinkler head. Number under symbol indicates distance in yards from that head to center of green.
- Denotes landmark – tree, edge of bunker or body of water, etc. Number under symbol indicates distance in yards from that point to center of green.
- ● ● Denotes 100, 150 & 200-yard markers.
- Charts show distance in yards from tees (designated by color-coded squares) to landmarks.

USGA Rules and posted Local Rules govern all play.

Local Rules

- Replace divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks on green.
- White stakes & lines indicate out-of-bounds.
- Red stakes & lines indicate lateral hazards.
- Yellow stakes and lines indicate water hazards.
- Golf carts shall not be used without proper assignment and registration in the Pro Shop.
- Each operator of a golf cart must be at least 16 years old and have a valid driver's license.
- Obey all traffic signs.
- Always use cart paths where provided, especially near tees and greens, and without exception on par 3 holes.
- Unless otherwise posted, the 90° rule will always be in effect. Drive directly to your ball, play your shot and leave the fairway by the shortest route.
- At the green, leave your cart as close as possible to the next tee.

Etiquette

- Your round should not exceed 4½ hours. Do not waste time. Play ready golf. Shoot out of turn if doing so speeds up play.
- All players are requested to keep up with the group in front. If there is an open hole ahead, let faster groups go through.
- Upon completing a hole, leave the green promptly and proceed to the next hole.
- The golf ranger has full authority on the golf course to maintain rules and speed of play for everyone's enjoyment.

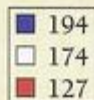

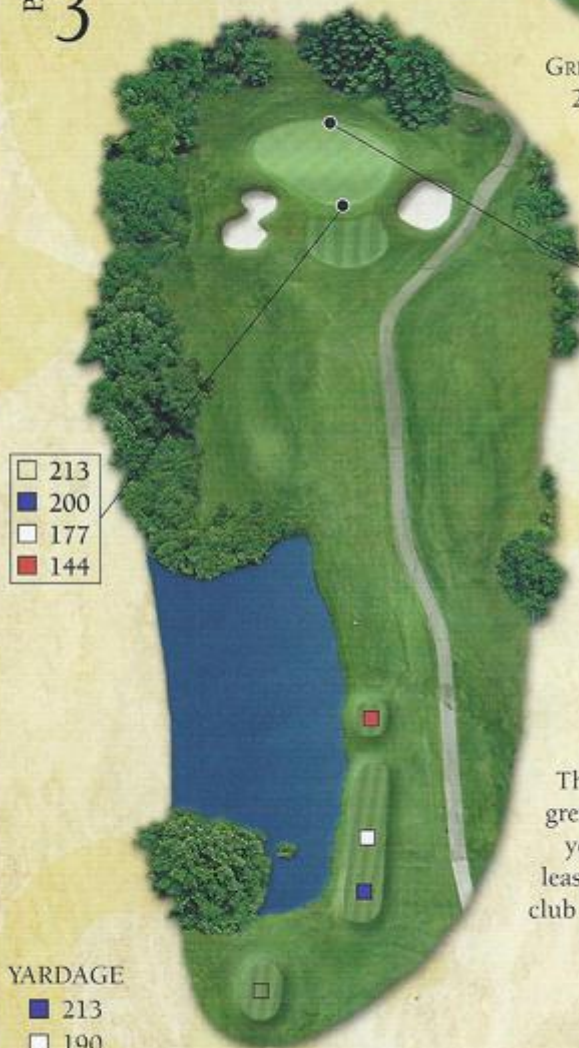
